Author's Purpose:

To Inform
To Entertain
To Persuade

Main Idea-the most important idea in a paragraph or passage

Topic Sentence- directly states the main idea in a paragraph

Supporting details-explain, describe, prove or give examples about the main idea and topic

Terms:

Synonym- a word with similar meaning to another word

Antonym-a word with the opposite/different meaning

Compare-find the similarities between two or more things

Contrast-find the difference between two or more things

Cause-is the reason why something happens

Effect- is the result of a cause

Fact- a statement that can be verified in a reference source

Opinion-a statement that shows personal belief or viewpoint

Predict-means to guess what will happen next based on information

Generalize-means to come to a broad conclusion based on specific information

Inference-is a determination a reader makes based on information and evidence provided in a passage.

Summary-is a short retelling of a passage. It includes the main idea and the most important details.

Paraphrase-is a restatement in the reader's own words

Plagiarism- claiming someone else's work as your own.

Figurative Language:

Simile-a comparison between two unlike things using like or as

Metaphor-a comparison between two unlike things that does not use like or as

Hyperbole-an extreme exaggeration

Idiom-a phrase that mean something different from its literal meaning; often particular to a region or group of people

Reference Material:

Reference-a source of information

Dictionary-an alphabetical list of words with their meaning, pronunciation, and origins

Thesaurus-an alphabetical list of words with their synonyms and antonyms

Periodical-regular publication-newspaper, magazine, journal that gives up to date information about current events/topics

Almanac- is a book published yearly that contains facts about the weather and events

Atlas-a book of maps

Encyclopedia-a collection of articles that give general information about a variety of topics

Web site-pages on the world wide web, electronic resources

Text Features:

Titles/headings/subheadings- give the main ideas of passages and parts of passages

Bold, italics, or all caps text- emphasizes key points and key words

Pictures, graphic, illustration, charts, diagrams, tables-offer useful visual explanations of text

Bulleted/numbered list- breaks complex ideas down into simple points
